The Campaign for Trade Union Freedom believes the anti-trade union laws introduced by the Conservatives between 1979 and 1995 must be repealed and replaced with a framework of positive rights.

Labour laws now are worse than they were over 100 years ago. Changes in the world of work – with the fragmentation of organisations and the growth of nonstandard work contracts – mean that the situation has continued to deteriorate for working people over the last thirty years.

Positive legislation in the field of industrial relations is required – laws which will protect trade unions from legal attacks, allow them to operate democratically and protect their members; laws which restore and extend collective bargaining, give each worker the right to strike and be represented by a union, protect workers against exploitation and provide the basis for a fairer and more just society.

The Campaign for Trade Union Freedom and our supporters lobby for changes in the law and organise mass campaign's to promote positive rights for workers but we need your help to continue.
